# Curriculum for PhD(HUMA) (For students admitted in 2010-11)

## **Program Requirements for Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) Program in Humanities**

### Credits

- 1. To fulfill **a minimum of 24 credits** of coursework at PG level offered by the Division, excluding HUMA 610 *Independent Study*.
- 2. Subject to the approval of the Division's PG Committee, students may be granted credits transfer of up to 6 credits.
- 3. Students enrolled in the program may specialize in Linguistics, Literature, History and Anthropology, or Philosophy and Religion.
  - a) <u>Linguistics Concentration</u>:
    - (i) Of the 24 credits of required coursework, 9 must be from:
      - HUMA 516 Chinese Historical Phonology;
      - HUMA 524 *Chinese Dialectology*; and
      - HUMA 527 Cantonese Linguistics
    - (ii) 3 credits must be taken in a discipline other than Linguistics.
    - (iii) The remaining 12 credits can be taken in the student's chosen field, to be decided in consultation with the thesis supervisor.

#### b) <u>Literature Concentration</u>:

- (i) Of the 24 credits of required coursework, 9 must be from:
  - HUMA 530 Chinese Literary History
  - HUMA 533 Traditional Chinese Literary Theory and Criticism;
  - HUMA 538 Modern Literary Theory I; or
  - HUMA 539 Modern Literary Theory II
- (ii) 3 credits must be taken in a discipline other than Literature; and
- (iii) The remaining 12 credits can be taken in the student's chosen field, to be decided in consultation with the thesis supervisor.

#### c) <u>History and Anthropology Concentration</u>:

#### Plan A - Chinese History

- (i) Of the 24 credits of required coursework, 9 must be from:
  - HUMA 555 Field Research: Theory and Practice;
  - HUMA 556 Methods in the Study of Source Materials; and
  - HUMA 558 Theories and Methods in East Asian History
- (ii) 3 credits must be taken in a discipline other than History and Anthropology.
- (iii) The remaining 12 credits can be taken in the student's chosen field, to be decided in consultation with the thesis supervisor.

Plan B - Cultural Anthropology and Social History

- (i) Of the 24 credits of required coursework, 9 must be from:
  - HUMA 555 Field Research: Theory and Practice;
  - HUMA 556 Methods in the Study of Source Materials; and
  - HUMA 558 Theories and Methods in East Asian History
- (ii) 3 credits must be taken in a discipline other than History and Anthropology.
- (iii) The remaining 12 credits can be taken in the student's chosen field, to be decided in consultation with the thesis supervisor.
- d) <u>Philosophy and Religion Concentration</u>:
  - (i) Of the 24 credits of required coursework, 3 must be from one of the following core courses:
    - HUMA 580 Fundamentals of Chinese Philosophy; or
    - HUMA 590 Fundamentals of Comparative Philosophy
  - (ii) 3 credits must be taken in a discipline other than Philosophy and Religion.
  - (iii) The remaining 18 credits can be taken in the student's chosen field, to be decided in consultation with the thesis supervisor.

#### Independent Study

If students wish to further broaden their interests and training in a special area, they may choose to take more coursework and/or enroll in an independent study course in addition to the regular 24-credit requirement. Under special circumstances, students may apply for substituting a regular course by an independent study course, subject to the approval of thesis supervisors and the PG Committee. However, no more than 2 independent study courses may be used for this purpose.

#### Language Requirements

In addition to English and Chinese, the PhD degree program requires students to acquire a level of competence in a third language (normally Japanese, French or German), as demonstrated either through satisfactory completion of a  $2^{nd}$  year language course taken within the last 5 years or through acceptable performance in a standardized examination. The third language requirement must be fulfilled no later than the semester in which the student completes the qualifying examination.

#### Qualifying Examination

To pass a written qualifying examination no later than the 6<sup>th</sup> semester of study (the 8<sup>th</sup> semester for part-time students).

#### **Research and PhD Thesis Examination**

- 1. To conduct research and enroll in HUMA 799 Doctoral Thesis Research; and
- 2. To defend the PhD thesis successfully.
- (a) A PhD thesis prospectus should be submitted to the PhD Thesis Supervision Committee no later than 6 months (9 months for part-time students) after successful completion of the qualifying examination.
- (b) The thesis is normally written in English. If a student wishes to use Chinese as the thesis language, prior approval must be obtained.
