With a Bachelor's in civil engineering and an expanding interest in sustainability in Malaysia, Cayden decided to pursue environmental engineering for his postgraduate studies.

It was close to my family in Malaysia and there was no language barrier as I was fluent in English, and had learned Cantonese from watching television dramas since childhood, which offered added convenience for my life in Hong Kong. This combination of intellectual development and practical application, his time at HKUST was a key asset for prospective employers.



Work and Entrepreneurship

Since Cayden graduated he has continued to embrace a variety of opportunities and overcome many challenges. The skills and experience he gained during his time at HKUST enabled him to seize a remarkable variety of career opportunities that were available to him.

After graduation from HKUST with a "dare to try" attitude, Cayden first founded a trading company with partners he met during his MPhil.



He moved on to assist a prominent Chinese marketing executive to access the Indian market. In this role, he was entrusted with the challenging responsibility of leading a team of 20 professionals tasked with understanding the key penetration methods within a new market. In addition, Cayden was given the responsibility of handling the logistics of the monthly visits of up to 100 prominent Chinese businesspeople.

This essential experience enabled him to seize the most unique opportunity of his post-HKUST career, a contract to work for the Shen Zhen Media Group, who were in India to film The Amazing Race. Using his local contacts with Chinese speakers in India, Cayden provided and organized 20 interpreters who were essential to the on-the-ground logistics of the production of the globally-renowned television series.

Now back in Malaysia putting his extensive marketing experience to full use, he is seeking to combine his MPhil knowledge, sales skills, and entrepreneurial dreams to start a business related to stormwater management or water treatment.
